- Mike Lyon asked the question about what would happen if the RET is changed. Frank Boland respond by outlining the likely impact on the viability of the Bodangora project under a few different RET outcome scenarios. These included; business as usual scenario, an dilution of the target and a worst case scrapping of the target scenario.
- Bob Sewell asked a question about the ACT reverse wind auction and financing appetite for investment on an ACT feed in tariff.
- The Chair then summarised the potential RET review scenarios and the mechanics of the ongoing political debate.

Discussion:

- Frank Boland provided some background context of the VPA negotiations, how they were initiated, how they compare to other projects, and the level of interaction with the Wellington Council.
 Peter Harlow then provided some further background from Council including a reference to the Environmental Planning and Assessment Amendment (Development Contributions) Act 2005
- He also then did a high level walk through of the VPA to point out the key features.
- Frank Boland reminded the group that this document is available on the council website and further outlined the commercial terms.
- Simon Barton asked a question to Peter about whether funds paid under the VPA to council would be spent outside of the council area. Peter responded saying that it could be possible that certain funds may be spent outside of the project area.
- Frank Barker made a comment about waste transfer and made a comment to council about this topic.
- Frank Barker made a comment on the condition of the Bodangora roads the timing of any proposed improvements.
- Frank Boland provided some clarity of the VPA and the associated timing of certain commitments under agreement in relation to other project activities.
- Peter Harlow estimated that it costs around \$147 per km to form new gravel roads.
- Frank Barker compared the agreement to Cobbora and questioned the costs involved in preparing the agreement.
