A NEW GENERATION

Bodangora Wind Farm has delivered its first generation to the National Electricity Market, marking an important milestone for the development.

Connection to the grid signifies commencement of the commissioning phase for the wind farm as the first of its kind in the area.

Depending on the wind speed, each turbine can generate up to 3.4 MW of power, with the wind farm providing enough output to supply power to up to 49,000 homes each year once fully commissioned.

Upon completion, the Bodangora Wind Farm will feature 33 turbines generating up to 113.2 MW of power into the electricity network, making a valuable contribution towards Australia meeting its Renewable Energy Target by 2020.

ABOUT BODANGORA WIND FARM

Bodangora Wind Farm is being constructed by a consortium of Civil and Allied Technical Construction Pty Ltd (CATCON) and General Electric International Inc. (GE) who manufacture and supply the wind turbines. The overhead powerlines connecting the wind farm to the electricity grid have been built by TransGrid.

Infigen Energy is the owner of the project and overseeing construction. The project is supported by a long-term full-service operation and maintenance agreement provided by GE who have supplied all the turbines for the project.

WHAT'S HAPPENING ON SITE?



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Since our last newsletter in April 2018, construction onsite has progressed well and the following work has been completed:

- All turbine foundations have been poured
- Roads and crane hardstandings are complete
- Installation of medium voltage cabling connecting the turbines has largely been completed
- 22 turbines are fully installed with four others installed up to hub height
- Work has commenced on the operation and maintenance building

With most civil works now completed, the focus for CATCON is to complete the operation and maintenance building as well as complete remediation and drainage works at site.

Delivery of turbine components to site will continue throughout August 2018 and turbine installation works using the main cranes at site is set to continue into September 2018.


With the installation work of many turbines now complete, GE have commenced commissioning and testing of the turbines. This work will continue over the coming months until all 33 turbines are fully operational and the final tests and inspections by the construction team has been completed.

I was born in Wellington and completed all my primary and secondary schooling here. Both my parents are from multigeneration farms in the Wellington district.


What are your thoughts on working on the first wind farm in the region?
