#### Discussion:

- Frank Barker opened discussions by tabling a letter regarding sitting fees and training. He also elaborated to say that he is on a pension and requires additional resources to fulfil his role as a CCC member, including a commute of around 20-30km.
- Frank Boland responded by stating that Infigen will look at what training options may be available for the committee and asked what his expectations were for the sitting fees.
- Frank Barker indicated that he thought \$50 per hour for minimum of 3 hrs + any vehicle expenses and paid retrospectively for all prior meetings attended.
- Simon Barton then asked about the type of training that Frank was seeking. Frank Barker responded by stating that safety training, first aid, meeting conduct would be beneficial. Lyn Jarvis then asked the same question to Frank Boland, who responded with energy markets training, consultation, and meeting conduct. Bob Sewell also suggested that project development/finance training would be helpful for members to understand the process.
