Capital East solar farm update



Infigen has recently completed the design and construction of the first stage of a demonstration grid-connected solar photovoltaic (PV) and energy storage facility.

The development and construction of the Capital East solar farm is providing valuable practical experience to Naomi Stringer, who is part of a University of NSW Co-op student internship program.

"I started work with Infigen last November and will be with them for the rest of the year, before going back to university in 2014. It's a great opportunity and has been a truly incredible experience so far. Having the opportunity to construct a solar farm is extremely exciting and far beyond what you can learn from a textbook. My supervisors have been fantastic - despite the endless questions they have had to put up with - and I can't wait to see Infigen expand its solar capacity in the future."

A day in the life of a wind farm site manager



Site manager David Brockwell looks after the 90 wind turbines at Capital and Woodlawn wind farms.

What does a typical work day look like?

There is no such thing as a typical day on our wind farms, but liaison with different teams as well as landowners is probably the major part of my job.

I drive throughout the wind farm regularly to check roads for erosion and surroundings of the turbines for bushfire risk. Most of our landowners have cattle and sheep on the land alongside the turbines. We need to ensure gates are not left open when attending the turbines.

What is the wind farm team like?

I work with 15 permanent employees from REpower Australia who are on site to operate and maintain both wind farms. All employees are locals from the Canberra area through to Goulburn. There is a great comradeship between the staff, making work much more enjoyable in an already great working environment.

Do you think Australia will shift towards renewable energy?

Renewable energy is here to stay. I look forward to a time when there are many more opportunities for employment in the region, in this much needed industry.

Business update

Infigen Energy (ASX: IFN) announced its fourth quarter production and revenue for the financial year 2013.

Highlights:

- Group production was 1,195 GWh, up 8%
- Australian production was 332 GWh, up 6%
- Group revenue was A\$77.1 million, up 17%
- Australian revenue was A\$34.2 million, up 17%
